At The hampstead Factory our principal aim is to help build your child's confidence through drama, movement/dance and singing within a one hour performance arts club for eleven sessions per term. Our teachers are carefully trained in the "Factory Method", a specific method of teaching children developed by the founder miss whittard over 15 years of teaching. Combined with a strong syllabus and regular holiday teacher training we are confident that we have the right mix to give your children exactly what they need from a caring and inspirational environment.

Every term children work towards a performance which covers a variety of different subjects.

What will I see in the end of term show? This term the little Angels will be performing The Emperor's new clothes and the Juniors "The twits" showing short bursts of:

INTRODUCTION- the teacher introduces the children and the work

MIME - youngsters express themselves through their face and body without the difficulty of words

SCRIPTED SCENE - acting work with learnt words and staging

MOVEMENT TO MUSIC - either a choreographed set dance/and or a devised routine helping youngsters to physically express themselves to music in an individual way

SINGING - singing to music

HOT SEATING - asking students questions about the terms work and characters

Why don't youngsters just perform a play like they do at school?

We believe that young children really want to experiment with different types of

creative expression, learning many different skills rather than just 1 or 2 so that as they get older they can begin to concentrate on their favorites in more detail. We also think that the above skills help them grow in a more rounded way through using their body, brains and voices all at the same time!

There will be no costume budget (as we are not requesting tickets from parents) so we would be grateful to parents to see if they have any items of clothing that may suit their child's character in one of the below plays:

The Emperor's New Clothes- Fun Fancy dress, party clothes. Emperor can have cloak/crown, Tricksters can be in black.

The Twits: Mr and Mrs Twit can have dirty, baggy old clothes, Muggle wumps bright, fun leggings and t shirt and coloured hair band.

If you have any of these items please ask your child to bring along for the “dress rehearsal” after half term. We would suggest most of the items can be found within the house as opposed to buying new.

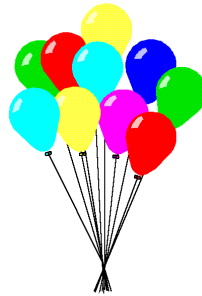
6. Birthday Parties

Hi Olivia, congratulations on getting the voice over role at Nick Junior, can you tell us a bit about the program and your character?

The programme is called Team Umi Zoomie and it's all about three characters called Millie (a little girl superhero), Geo (a little boy superhero) and Bot (their robot sidekick) who are minute sized maths super heroes who help a place called Umi City to solve problems. For example, if someone loses something or if something goes wrong, the city's people can call Team Umi Zoomie who will be there in a second to sort the problem out. The characters use their mighty maths powers to help people in their hour of need. For example, in one episode the city runs out of milk and there is no milk for the children's cereal. Three children call Team Umi Zoomie for help and the three super heroes come to the

rescue. Geo uses his super shapes to create a truck that carries milk to Umi City and Millie uses her pattern power to sort the cows in to different flavours of milk whilst Bot helps them along the way by using his belly screen to show how the children are getting along and his Botomat to carry important items along the journey. In another episode a character called Silly Bear finds some honey for his honey pie but Geo and Bot get stuck in the honey by mistake and get taken back to Silly Bear's cave where they could accidentally be eaten. It's up to Millie to save the day which she does by using her patten power to find the way to Silly Bear's cave so that she can alert him to the fact that Geo and Bot are trapped in the honey.

I play the part of Geo which I thought was a bit weird at first because I am a girl playing a boys part. In the end I didn't mind because I got the chance to be in a real recording studio and begin my acting career.

How did you feel when they told you got the role?

My jaw dropped and I was speechless. I couldn't believe that I had been picked to play a character on a real live TV show and I felt really proud of myself for getting the part and my sister was really pleased too

What do you feel is the best way to learn your scripts?

Yes, if you want to do voice over work it's important to speak clearly so people can understand you easily, be prepared to put lots of expression in to what you say to make your voice interesting and easy for viewers to understand.
